Functions, Fissures and Failures: How artistic research can break and build societal strategies

July 26th – Aug 2nd, 2017 in Saulkrasti, Latvia

Procedure 1 – Scholarships

Scholarships are available for those from Nordic countries, the Baltic Countries, and from the Autonomous areas: Greenland, the Faroe Islands and Åland.

To apply for the scholarships, you must be a **full or part-time student**. A student is someone who is studying at Nordic/Baltic/Autonomous area university regardless of citizenship, **or** as a Nordic/Baltic/Autonomous areas student studying at a non-Nordic university. For application to be valid, students need to send in the following information to the coordinators of the circle they are applying for:

- Full name, email and current academic status (actual documentation about the studies at a Nordic/Baltic/Autonomous area University must be provided.)
- Citizenship and place of study
- Numbers of attended NSU events, including both Winter and Summer
- Description of possible presentation
- Reasons for applying for scholarship / Why should NSU give you the Scholarship?

Priority should be given to:

- Presentation of a paper over only participating
- Recruitment of the Nordic/Baltic/Autonomous areas that are not present in a circle.
- Years and/or active participation in NSU
- Other strong reasons, for example, related to the applicant's' needs.

DEADLINE IS MAY 1ST

Procedure 2 – Grants

Grants are for anyone in need of subsidy or support in order to participate, despite nationality or place of residence. For example, if you are in temporary employment, or other special circumstances, including having a low disposable income, or high travel costs when coming from the peripheral areas of the Nordic region. Other criteria include physical disability, family travelling with two or more children, or single parents travelling with one or more children, etc.

For application to be valid applicants need to send in the following information to the coordinators of the circle they are applying for.

- Full name, e-mail and citizenship
- Current employment/academic status
- Numbers of attended NSU events, including both in Winter and Summer.
- Description of possible presentation
- Reasons for applying for grant / Why should NSU give you the grant?

Priority should be given to:

- Presentation of paper over only participating
- Years and/or active participation in NSU
- Reason for application – Strong reasons (for example: low disposable income, or high travel costs when coming from the peripheral areas of the Nordic region, being an independent scholar, physical disability, family travelling with two or more children, or single parents travelling with one or more children, etc...)
